1.1	What progress have you made on your Inclusive data priorities/ IDC Action Plan priorities in the past year?	Include examples to accompany any highlights or achievements.	We continue to the make progress on our commitments, including advocating for inclusive data generation and use in conversations with partners and when designing our programmes. In our development programming, we strive to focus on the most marginalised. This includes using the Washington Group Questions to identify beneficiaries living with disabilities and advocating for the mainstreaming of use of Washington Group questions for all programmes so that data can be disaggregated. FCDO maintains active representation at the Titchfield City Group on Ageing and age disaggregation.		

			The FCDO has changed markedly since our IDC action plan was drafted under legacy Departments for International Development. Since the merger, new processes and strategies, such as the Integrated Review and the International Development Strategy, have been launched. We recognise that now is a good time to review our Inclusive Data Charter Action plan and redevelop it such that it integrates well with these new strategies.
1.2	What areas of your Inclusive data priorities/ IDC Action Plan have you made the least progress on, in the past year?	Include any challenges or barriers faced.	Due to the merger and the need for systems alignment, previous results measurement processes such as the Single Departmental Plan, which were avenues for the organisation to push for central results disaggregation, have been discontinued. It has in part been replaced by cross-government accountability processes such as the Outcome Delivery Plan (ODP), and thematic areas take the lead on disaggregating their own results – such as the recently released results for International Climate Finance. This fragmentation is a challenge that is recognised, and senior leaders are taking steps to collaborate more with the FCDO's Statistics and Evaluation cadres to resolve it.
1.3	Have there been any changes to your Inclusive data priorities/ IDC Action Plan objectives in the last year?	<b>(Yes, No)</b> <i>If yes, please give details of any changes</i>	Yes. FCDO's IDC action plan is currently being reviewed, with the view to make sure it adequately captures the new capabilities and processes put in place since the merger of the legacy Foreign Office and the Department for International Development. The FCDO's International Development Strategy prioritises empowering women and girls and reducing humanitarian need, as well as tackling climate and protecting nature, improving health, and strengthening health systems. These are thematic areas of focus for us, all of which would benefit from the generation and use of disaggregated data, enabling us to better target interventions towards the most vulnerable.

Being part of the IDC has helped us in dialogues with the G7 and other partners about inclusive data. We want to do more engagement on this going forward, particularly on convening partners to address the gender data financing gap, which has grown markedly since the COVID-19 pandemic.

We have shared best practice informally at the margins of events throughout the year and at communities of practices e.g., presenting our work on identifying the 'Bottom Billion'. Our programme managers continue to engage with local partners on how best to track the impact of our work on the most marginalised. Existing processes such as annual reviews demonstrate how this is systematised in our programming work. The FCDO is in the process of reviewing its IDC Action Plan, to make it fit for purpose for the new strategic direction of the merged organisation. We want to do more engagement work going forward, particularly given we will have limited funding for large scale projects in the coming years. We want to ensure we are making best use of our expertise, diplomatic network, and partnerships to champion inclusive data.
