This can also include any COVID-19 related reflections</i>	Due to having to reallocate time and resources to our response to the pandemic, as well as funding constraints, several areas of our action plan are yet to see concrete steps taken. While many of our network members have continued to gather and share data about the impact of COVID-19 and containment measures on street-connected children, which CSC has collated, this data has been predominately anecdotal.

We have adjusted the timelines for several of our actions that we had intended to begin this year, to start instead in 2021.
