1.1	What progress have you made on your Inclusive data priorities/ IDC Action Plan priorities in the past year?	Include examples to accompany any highlights or achievements.	<p>HelpAge's Rapid Needs Assessment (RNA) continues to be a go to tool to establish minimum SAD data in humanitarian settings with a focus in the last years on building partner engagement in the data collection process.</p> <p>There have been efforts to better engage local older communities in the data collection process in the RNA activities, i.e Kasese Flood in Uganda, where older members were trained as enumerators and collected data in their respective communities and led the feedback to the local authorities.</p>

			<p>The RNA has also been reviewed to strengthen the data collection process, ensuring the data analysis is now visualised using Power BI. This has contributed to more in-depth analysis of the data and sharing to wider audiences.</p> <p>Out of Sight, Out of Mind Research (https://www.helpage.org/resources/publications/) highlights the next steps in data work at HelpAge, based on the 2018 study, 'If not now, when?', which highlighted significant failings in how the humanitarian system includes older people when responding to crises</p> <p>Training and workshops in Colombia and Venezuela on the use of Sphere and Humanitarian Inclusion Standards in October 2020 with a Start learning grant strongly promoted the use of SADD data tools, the use of 10-year age cohorts and the Washington Group questions supporting over 40 national NGOs in the region to strengthen their data collection tools.</p> <p>HelpAge continues to ensure all funding proposals include a component on disability-inclusive analysis and the importance of collecting, analyzing and reporting against intersectional disaggregated data.</p> <p>Ongoing design of digital data system that is intended to improve the quality of data analysis, better dissemination and utilization of data.</p>
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1.2	What areas of your Inclusive data priorities/ IDC Action Plan have you made the least progress on, in the past year?	Include any challenges or barriers faced.	HelpAge's structural changes and move towards a more locally-led model has highlighted the need for consistency in processes among teams. A challenge we currently face is how to re-establish and maintain that consistency as our ways of working continuously evolve. This has also affected wider engagement with external stakeholders, given reduced staff capacity following the restructures and resources constraints due to reduced income as a result COVID lockdown measures.
