1.1	What progress have you made on your Inclusive data priorities/ IDC Action Plan priorities in the past year?	Include examples to accompany any highlights or achievements.	<p>We have continued to collect primary data on the impacts of displacement on IDPs and host communities, in 6 countries in 2021, and already 2 more planned for early 2022. All of these studies include data disaggregated by sex, age, disability status, education and income levels and more. With this, we have been able to highlight differentiated impacts of displacement on women, girls, boys, men, IDPs with disabilities, and more groups of affected people with characteristics that lead to specific needs and resources.</p> <p>In addition, at the global level, we have developed a new database which will enable us to record more consistently datasets from other organisations that disaggregate numbers of IDPs by sex and age. This should be in use in 2022.</p>

			We published several papers on IDPs with disabilities in 2021, and our progress in data on internally displaced children has allowed us to choose them as the focus of our next Global Report on Internal Displacement, to be released in May 2022.
1.2	What areas of your Inclusive data priorities/ IDC Action Plan have you made the least progress on, in the past year?	Include any challenges or barriers faced.	The estimation of the global number of IDPs by sex and age, and disability status. This is linked with the scarcity of disaggregated datasets across data collecting organisations around the world, and one of the reasons why we started collecting data ourselves in specific locations. For the moment, we have to keep using national level demographic distribution data to estimate these numbers.

We have also engaged increasingly with organisations working on people with disabilities, such as Humanity & Inclusion and the International Disability Alliance.
