1.1	What progress have you made on your IDC action plan in the past year?	Include any highlights or achievements with examples. This can also include any COVID-19 related reflections	<ul> <li>We have been working to prepare a global review on homeless data (Action Plan 3.1). IGH's Better Data Project is designed to better understand the range of available homeless data and spotlight issues in data quality and definition.</li> <li>For the next stage of the Better Data Project, we are now working on our next step is to analyze the data further to review quality (timeliness, methodology) and also another dimension to review disaggregation of the data.</li> <li>We have launched the Better Data Project and discussed our involvement with IDC at the C20 Summit.</li> </ul>

			<ul> <li>We have also shared resources with the 13 Vanguard Cities on conducting COVID-19 assessments including increasing disaggregation on health data.</li> <li>We have continued our advocacy at the UN (Action Plan 1.4, 2.2) including recently collaborating with UN DESA and UN Habitat on multiple events for Urban October, These events highlighted important intersecting issues and how to best address homelessness on a global scale. These events served not only to have multi-sectoral conversations but to create sustainable relationships between IGH and other UN agencies. We are currently exploring next steps in our work with these agencies. We've also connected with the office of the Special Rapporteur on the Right to Adequate Housing in order to get feedback on a pathway to getting a global count on homelessness. We are looking to convene a small group of experts with the Working Group on Homelessness in January of February to determine next steps. We are just in the initial brainstorming phases of putting that together, but we are taking special care to make sure that it is globally representative.</li> <li>Finally, we still have plans to put together a first convening of member states invested in passing policy.</li> </ul>
1.2	What areas of your IDC action plan have you made the least progress on, in the past year?	Include any challenges or barriers faced. This can also include any COVID-19 related reflections	COVID-19 has made collection of homeless data, especially street counts more difficult. Due to COVID-19 precautions and the increase of cases, for many Vanguard Cities that are planning to do Winter homeless street counts are reevaluating their methodologies. For many cities, assessment of people living in shelters and self-contained accommodation has increased, which has led to more

			detailed and robust data which has led to targeted housing placement.  For our work at the UN, COVID has made it difficult to connect with Member States. Member states that we don't already have connections with are likely not to take on more than they already have, and member states we do already have connections with are quite busy right now. Recently we were working with the United Nations Working Group to End Homelessness (WGEH) to try to get a resolution to the third committee of the UN, but ultimately that did not turn out. We are making the connections between COVID and housing, but not all member states see it that way. However, we are still making progress.
