This can also include any COVID-19 related reflections	We have continued to add indicators to our SDG platform, and work on disaggregations. Particular achievements include: • We have added new questions to the Family Resource Survey to help answer questions around food insecurity. We expect results in March 2021. • We have worked with the Department for Work and Pensions to ensure that the disaggregations we need will be part of their analysis but have also arranged access to microdata should we need to do further analysis.

1.2	What areas of your IDC action plan have you made the least progress on, in the past year?	Include any challenges or barriers faced. This can also include any COVID-19 related reflections	 We are working closely with the ONS Geography team to source data using new indicators. This team also sit on the UNGGIM (UN Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management) Europe working group on data integration for SDGs. This group has identified indicators where they feel countries could collaborate to improve methodology and integrate geospatial data into SDGs, so ONS will be working on some of these indicators as part of this group, benefitting from collaborating with other countries. The least progress has probably been in the area of migratory status, for which we have not secured as many disaggregations as we would have liked. Covid-19 has slowed down work against our predominantly SDG-focussed IDC action plan, but has led to data linkages elsewhere that have enabled new analysis, such as deaths by ethnicity (a variable not currently collected at death registration). Another challenge is the fact that disaggregations are not harmonised across our suite of SDG indicators, which is something we are now working on.
